## **Chegg**

## **College Board CSS Profile**

One of the most comprehensive college and scholarship search engines is sponsored by College Board.

Many universities and colleges now require students to complete a CSS Profile in addition to completing the FAFSA before being considered for financial aid and/or scholarships. The CSS Profile will be connected to a student's College Board account (used for SAT, AP, and other services). ## **FAFSA**

If you want to be considered for any financial aid or scholarships, all US citizens will need to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). It is possible to complete the FAFSA any time after the window opens on October 1st each year through June 30th for the following school-year. The sooner you apply, the better as funds for grants and work-study run out quickly. In California, colleges and universities require students to have their FAFSA and Cal Grant verifications completed by March 2nd each year.
